Treatment Plants

The treatment plants continue to meet constituent discharge requirements on a routine basis. There have been no discharge violations due to Equipment Failure.

Spill Response

Update: The State has not contacted me again in regards to the spill on March 15, 2023 at Huston Creek WWTP. No fines as of today's date have been issued.

Collection System

Crews are continuing with regular operations, daily inspections of District lift stations, issuance of correction notices for repairs on private laterals, and inspections on all repairs. Throughout the month, collection staff inspected waterways and the district effluent outfall line after all rain events. For the month of April, the district hydraulically cleaned 7,108 feet of line and CCTV 1,892 feet.

Strategic Plan

The District is proceeding with getting phase one of the Master Plan accomplished.

Disbursements 1 and 2 have been received from the State Revolving Fund

Regulatory Compliance: District is maintaining a >90% compliance currently through the 2023 calendar year...i.e., < 2 SSO's, RWQCB Plant Discharge Requirements.

<u>Customer Service:</u> The District continues to maintain < 1% customer complaints.

<u>Facilities & Infrastructure:</u> Staff removed fallen trees from 4000' road. Filled and graded 4000' pipeline road.
