Treatment Plants

The treatment plants continue to meet constituent discharge requirements on a routine basis.

Collection System

Crews are continuing with regular operations, daily inspections of District lift stations, issuance of correction notices for repairs on private laterals, and inspections on all repairs. Throughout the month, collection staff inspected waterways and the district effluent outfall line after all rain events.

For May the district hydraulically cleaned 32,930 feet of line, and raised 13 manholes

Regulatory Compliance: District is maintaining a >90% compliance currently through the 2024 calendar year...i.e., < 2 SSO's, RWQCB Plant Discharge Requirements.

Facilities & Infrastructure

There have been no discharge violations due to equipment failure

Talking Points

- Construction continues on the plant upgrades as scheduled, the seal coat on the new primary Clarifier has been reapplied and is awaiting testing. The new gear drives for the sludge transfer pumps have been ordered and are awaiting shipping.
- New company Employee Identification Badges were created and issued to all permanent staff members and will be valid until the end of the year, a new ID will be issued to each employee yearly.
- At the direction of the board, Management has instructed WEBB and Associates to prepare an engineering report for the erosion at the Seeley Creek Treatment plant hillside directly adjacent to the plant driveway, front gate, and headworks.
- Operations Staff is continuing moving forward with the landscaping and erosion control at Huston Creek. Last week they prepared the soil and replaced the sprinkler piping and valves on the former lawn area. They have also reseeded this area and are watering it each night in hopes of a prompt resurgence of our lawn.
