RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CRESTLINE SANITATION DISTRICT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING AN APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022

WHEREAS, the Crestline Sanitation District ("the District") is a county sanitation district organized and operating pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 4700 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Article XIIIB of the Constitution of the State of California, as approved by the voters at the special statewide election held on November 6, 1979, provides for an annual appropriations limitation for local jurisdictions adjusted for changes in population and consumer prices index; and

WHEREAS, the State legislation added Division 9 (Commencing with Section 7900) to Title 1 of the Government Code of the State of California to implement Article XIIIB of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Section 7910 of the Government Code provides that each year the governing body of each local jurisdiction shall, by resolution, establish its appropriations limit for the following fiscal year pursuant to Article XIIIB at a regularly scheduled meeting or a noticed special meeting and that fifteen (15) days prior to such meeting, documentation used in the determination of the appropriations limit shall be available to the public; and

WHEREAS, Section 7902 of the Government Code sets forth the method for determining the appropriations limit for each local jurisdiction for each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District's Board of Directors wishes to establish the District's appropriations limit for fiscal year 2021-2022 ("the Fiscal Year").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Crestline Sanitation District as follows:

Section 1. The appropriations limit for the District for the Fiscal Year, as established in accordance with Section 7902 of the Government Code, is set forth as \$7,064,081.

Section 2. It is hereby found and determined that the documentation used in establishing the appropriations limit for the Fiscal Year was available to the public in District's offices at least fifteen (15) days prior to this date.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

Section 4. The Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and Office of the State Auditor/Controller forty-five (45) days after the effective date of the resolution.



Subject: Price Factor and Population Information

Appropriations Limit

California Revenue and Taxation Code section 2227 requires the Department of Finance (Finance) to transmit an estimate of the percentage change in population to local governments. Each local jurisdiction must use their percentage change in population factor for January 1, 2021, in conjunction with a change in the cost of living, or price factor, to calculate their appropriations limit for fiscal year 2021-22. Attachment A provides the change in California's per capita personal income and an example for utilizing the price factor and population percentage change factor to calculate the 2021-22 appropriations limit. Attachment B provides the city and unincorporated county population percentage change. Attachment C provides the population percentage change for counties and their summed incorporated areas. The population percentage change data excludes federal and state institutionalized populations and military populations.

Population Percent Change for Special Districts

Some special districts must establish an annual appropriations limit. California Revenue and Taxation Code section 2228 provides additional information regarding the appropriations limit. Article XIII B, section 9(C) of the California Constitution exempts certain special districts from the appropriations limit calculation mandate. The code section and the California Constitution can be accessed at the following website: http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/faces/codes.xhtml.

Special districts required by law to calculate their appropriations limit must present the calculation as part of their annual audit. Any questions special districts have on this requirement should be directed to their county, district legal counsel, or the law itself. No state agency reviews the local appropriations limits.

Population Certification

The population certification program applies only to cities and counties. California Revenue and Taxation Code section 11005.6 mandates Finance to automatically certify any population estimate that exceeds the current certified population with the State Controller's Office. **Finance will certify the higher estimate to the State Controller by June 1, 2021**.

Please Note: The prior year's city population estimates may be revised. The per capita personal income change is based on historical data. Given the stay-at-home orders due to COVID-19, growth in the coming years may be substantially lower than recent trends.

Attachment

A. **Price Factor**: Article XIII B specifies that local jurisdictions select their cost of living factor to compute their appropriation limit by a vote of their governing body. The cost of living factor provided here is per capita personal income. If the percentage change in per capita personal income is selected, the percentage change to be used in setting the fiscal year 2021-22 appropriation limit is:

Per Capita Personal Income

Fiscal Year (FY) Percentage change over prior year

2021-22

5.73

B. Following is an example using sample population change and the change in California per capita personal income as growth factors in computing a 2021-22 appropriation limit.

2021-22:

Per Capita Cost of Living Change = 5.73 percent Population Change = -0.46 percent

Per Capita Cost of Living converted to a ratio:

5.73 + 100 = 1.0573

100

Population converted to a ratio:

-0.46 + 100 = 0.9954

100

Calculation of factor for FY 2021-22:

 $1.0573 \times 0.9954 = 1.0524$
