

OPERATIONS MANAGER - STATUS REPORT

Treatment Plants

The treatment plants continue to meet constituent discharge requirements on a routine basis.

Collection System

Crews are continuing with regular operations, daily inspections of District lift stations, issuance of correction notices for repairs on private laterals, and inspections on all repairs. Throughout the month, collection staff inspected waterways and the district effluent outfall line after all rain events. For August the district hydraulically cleaned 8,360 feet of line, and raised 20 manholes.

Regulatory Compliance: District is maintaining a >90% compliance currently through the 2024 calendar year...i.e., < 2 SSO's, RWQCB Plant Discharge Requirements.

Facilities & Infrastructure

There have been no discharge violations due to equipment failure

Talking Points

- Construction continues on the plant upgrades as scheduled, Remobilization of the project started on Aug. 8th and has continued on schedule with Leed electric working on terminations at the newly delivered panels. SCE plans on a pole upgrade and inspection for cutover on Sept. 18th.
- Operations staff has continued with painting the H.C. plant in between their normal duties.
- Management has reached out to contractors for quotes to repair the S.C. erosion project based off the engineering report submitted by Webb and associates for the repair and retention of the hillsides at the S.C. treatment plant.
- Operator training for exams continue out at the treatment plants, with a focus on operations math and general knowledge. The new Operator in Training at H.C. is showing promise having completed his courseware to qualify for his OIT Certificate and preparing his application for the OIT certificate now.
