

OPERATIONS MANAGER - STATUS REPORT

Treatment Plants

The treatment plants continue to meet constituent discharge requirements on a routine basis.

Collection System

Crews are continuing with regular operations, daily inspections of District lift stations, issuance of correction notices for repairs on private laterals, and inspections on all repairs. Throughout the month, collection staff inspected waterways and the district effluent outfall line after all rain events. For October the district hydraulically cleaned 13,096 feet of line, and televised 7,171 feet of line.

Regulatory Compliance: District is maintaining a >90% compliance currently through the 2024 calendar year...i.e., < 2 SSO's, RWQCB Plant Discharge Requirements.

Facilities & Infrastructure

There have been no discharge violations due to equipment failure

Talking Points

- Construction continues on the plant upgrades as scheduled, The Transformer we had to reorder was shipped on November 6th and we are waiting on delivery.
- Operations staff rebuilt the secondary sludge pump at Huston Creek, and Maintenance staff have rebuilt the retaining wall at Huston Creek plant as well as installed a French drain behind it.
- Management has started Winter weather prep, vehicle tire chains have all been installed and tested prior to first snow. Winter weather gear has been ordered for new employees and those needing replacements. Staff has conducted emergency bypass training at all lift stations and at Huston Creek Plant in preparation for the upcoming wet season.
- Management has reviewed and updated the On Call, Standard Operating procedures and have conducted a training with all staff to ensure all employees have a proper understating of On Call Protocols. We also hosted an in person defensive driving training class this month.
